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RESULTS Mentoring was founded in 1999 by Charles Thomas, Jr. to support an underserved population of urban youth with educational enrichment opportunities. Throughout his adult life, Mr. Thomas has worked to improve the lives of troubled youth. This has been achieved not only by managing this organization, but also by volunteering at many nonprofit organizations including Detroit PAL, Detroit Area Council Boy Scouts of America and Partners Against Crime. His career also has been focused on helping students excel while holding positions in various schools such as Dean of Students, Mentor as well as parent liaison in public and charter schools. He has a Master Degree in Educational Leadership and is a Certified School Administrator with the Michigan Department of Education. Mr. Thomas is an Ordained Elder and has been a Minister of the

Gospel since 1992. His passion is to see young people excel; especially the children who have been written off by society.

In 2007, RESULTS Mentoring was awarded non-profit status. Mr. Thomas and his team has steadily worked on growing the organization by developing relationships with the business and local community and finding other mentors and leaders that can help fulfill the mission of RESULTS Mentoring. Results Mentoring stands for Reaching Every Student Using Love Training and Support. Behavioral Intervention is our primary program of offering. The organization focuses on three programs to bring about the best in its youth: tutoring, mentoring and redirection toward a positive goal-driven life. Our tutorial program is designed to improve test scores as well as to increase student morale, reconstruct the mindset of aspiring students and change the lives of the young people and families. The mentoring program is designed to build self-esteem, improve the mentality and outlook and encourage greatness within the young people that we service. Finally, the Redirection Program works with youth who have been deemed incorrigible. These troubled youth are shown another path to attain success.

Results Mentoring is also an external service provider with the Michigan Department of Education where we help schools make yearly progress utilizing their School Improvement Grant (SIG) funding. It has provided Supplemental Educational Services in the states of Texas, Arizona, Ohio and Michigan. Impressive changes have come about in the young people that have completed the tutorial and mentoring programs. Young people who were written off by parents, teachers and other family members have been embraced and elevated as a RESULT of this program. Students who were failing many of their classes have been taught to embrace their natural born intelligence and talent and to use these gifts to strive for more. They have met and exceeded the challenge and all should be proud of their achievements.

RESULTS Mentoring has provided services in several Metropolitan Detroit and Oakland County schools including the Detroit Public Schools, Charter School Academy Services Academy of Inkster, Academy of Warren, Tyrone Elementary in Harper Woods, Conner Creek West in Warren, Pontiac Academy for Excellence, Academy of Warren, Clintondale Middle School, Global Preparatory Academy and others with individual student enrollment. Our students become lifelong members in our program.

The RESULTS Mentoring executive team has provided tutorial, mentoring and redirection services for over 20 years. This leadership team knows how to reach troubled youth because many of the staff share similar backgrounds and challenges of these young adults. They have the creative fortitude to reach young people and redirect them to a path of excellence.

The RESULTS Mentoring team has a great working relationship with the parents that we serve because we listen and we learn! Many call it a gift others a talent and some feel it is luck, but whatever the case may be...this program has proven to be life changing.





Hester's career began in 1985, as an engineering technician for General Motors Advanced Engineering. Joining Regal Plastics in 1987, he quickly moved up the ranks from engineering to program management, through sales and marketing, and finally rose to vice president in 1993.

In 1998, Hester was selected to serve as president of GAA's company, ARD, near Atlanta, Georgia. By 2003 he co-founded and was named president of GAA's newest acquisition, Key Logistics.

Ultimately before starting his own enterprise, he rose to the position of chairman of all GAA companies, and CEO of Grupo Antolin Primera.

Hester was appointed to and served a four-year tenure as a Tuskegee University Board of Trustees member. He is a current member of Karmanos Cancer Institute, Grow Michigan II, Ben Carson High School Advisory Council, Industrial Advisory Board of the Electrical & Computer Engineering Department of the University of Michigan-Dearborn, and Michigan Minority Supplier Development Council, and Chair of the MBEIC and Manufacturing and Mobility sector.

Hester holds a Master of Science in Administration degree, with concentration in leadership, from Central Michigan University, and a Bachelor of Science in Plastics Engineering with an emphasis in polymer chemistry from Ferris State University. 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Game Changer Awa'd Khary K. Turner

Education leader, author and artist Khary Kimani Turner has spent 30 years using his talents to grow community. The Executive Director for Coleman A. Young Foundation (CAYF) leads a 42-year mission to help Detroit youth access and persist through college, and then enter the workforce poised for leadership. CAYF Scholars have, since 1995, maintained a 90% college graduation rate, and 60% have returned to metropolitan Detroit to live and work.

Khary's creative pedigree prepared him to be an innovative nonprofit leader. The intersection of his experiences then helped to fuel innovative results. As CAYF youth and scholars continue to accel, a campaign to place a statue of late Detroit Mayor Coleman Young in the United States Capital promises to tell "The Mayor's" story nationally, establish a permanent visual model for hopefuls worldwide. It also helps Coleman A. Young Foundation's mission persist. The Foundation, acting as fiduciary for the campaign under Khary's leadership, is poised to strike a simultaneous blow for history and education.

A creative at heart, Khary has won five Detroit Music Awards for contributions to Detroit's sonic community. Meanwhile his writings, in publishing and music, influenced the work of artists like the Notorious B.I.G., and the legendary Broadway play "Hamilton," and earned him a Grammy.

Khary is a board member for the Diploma Equity Project, and is a member of the Business Network, Incorporated (BNI).

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Community Award Rodney Cole

Rodney Cole is president of the DTE Energy Foundation and Corporate Citizenship at DTE. Appointed in 2023, he is responsible for leading the DTE Foundation's operations and grant strategies. He leads the company's Corporate Citizenship work within the communities where DTE's 10,000-plus employees live and serve.
